Time Zone: A time zone is an area of Earth that has a specific time that all citizens set their clocks to. Different places on earth have different time zones.

Greenwich Meantime: The time zone for the UK.

Moscow: The capital and largest city in Russia.

Berlin: Germany's capital city.

Ankara: The capital city of Turkey.

Border: A line that defines and separates one country from another.

Location: A place where a particular point or object exists.

Region: An area of land which has common features.

Turkey: A country that lies partly in Europe and partly in Asia.

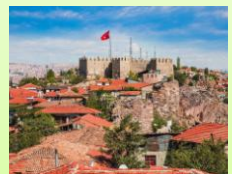
Russia: The largest country in the world. It crosses two continents and is bordered by three oceans (the Atlantic, Arctic and Pacific).

Germany: A country in Central Europe. It is the second most populated country in Europe (after Russia).

Europe: One of the seven continents.

Continent: The Earth's land is categorised into 7 continents.

Country: An area of land united as it is controlled by the same government.
